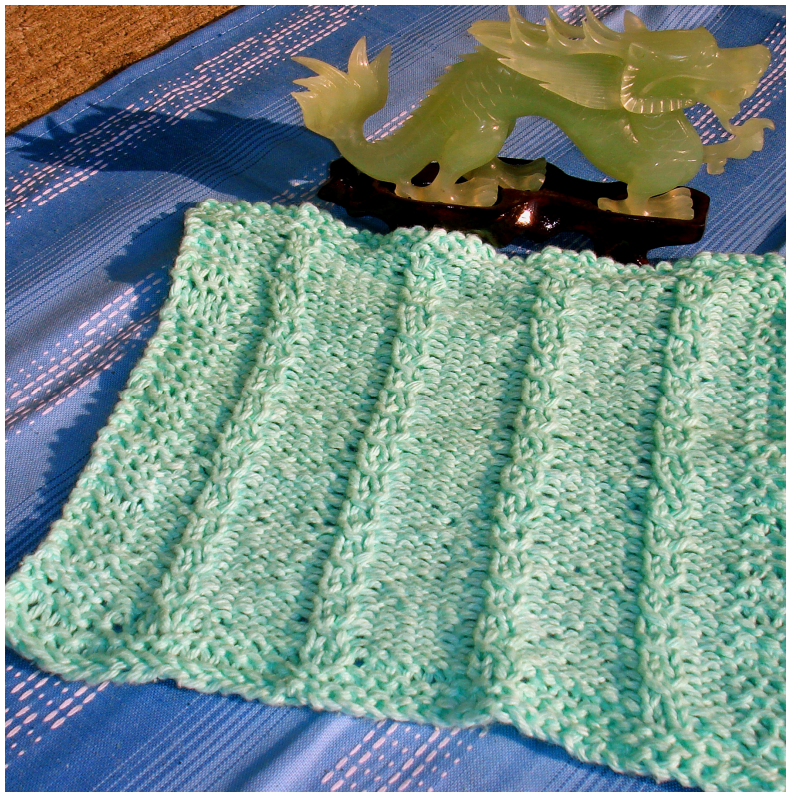


Loom Knit Mock Cable Dishcloth

Moderate Easy
Measures approx. 8" x 8"

This mock cable dishcloth looks nice on both sides. I recommend a solid color so the texture stands out. This makes a nice gift washcloth paired with some handmade soap, or make in a baby color as a baby washcloth. It could also be used as a square for a blanket in the manner of Mason Dixon knitting. Give yourself a smile when you do the dishes, wash your face, or clean counters.



Supplies:

- Fine Gauge knitting loom of any type with at least 40 pegs. This piece will be knit flat but a round loom may be used. Just turn and go back when you get to the 40th peg. Do not join the stitches in the round and it will be flat panel knitting.
- 1/2 Ball worsted weight cotton dishcloth yarn - sample used was Peaches and Creme Baby Green 4 Ply by Elmore Pisgah available at WalMart.
- Tapestry needle, scissors, crochet hook. (size I was used for sample)
- Stitch markers or scrap yarn used to mark the pegs for where your purl stitches will be.

Pattern Notes:

The pattern is knit from right to left on odd rows and left to right on even rows.

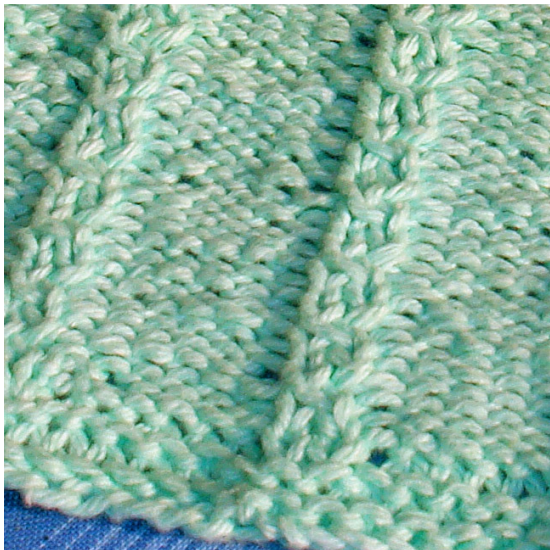
Cast on ---->

R1 <----

R2 ---->

The P2Tog is made by removing the loop from the left peg and putting it on the right peg. Then e-wrap the empty peg and knit off the now double looped peg in a purl stitch.

Tip: 100% Cotton does not have a lot of "give" to it. Keep your tension a bit loose and you will be much more relaxed and happy with your results. Remember that the mock cable rows have to be moved over a peg so keep them loose enough to do that. I use my knitting tool to loosen each knit stitch after it's formed.



Pattern:

Cast on 40 pegs on any fine gauge knitting loom using the crochet cast on.

Row 1: K Across

Row 2: P Across

Row 3: K Across

Row 4: P Across

Row 5: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7

Row 6: P4, K3, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K3, P4

Row 7: K4, K3, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7

Row 8: P4, K3, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K3, P4

Repeat rows 5-8 14 more times for the body of the cloth (As follows)

Row 9: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7
Row 10: P4, K3, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K3, P4
Row 11: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7
Row 12: P4, K3, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K3, P4

Row 13: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7
Row 14: P4, K3, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K3, P4
Row 15: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7
Row 16: P4, K3, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K3, P4

Row 17: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7
Row 18: P4, K3, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K3, P4
Row 19: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7
Row 20: P4, K3, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K3, P4

Row 60: P4, K3, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K3, P4

Row 61: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7
Row 62: P4, K3, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K3, P4
Row 63: K7, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K6, P2, K7
Row 64: P4, K3, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K6, P2Tog, K3, P4

Row 65: K Across
Row 66: P Across
Row 67: K Across
Row 68: P Across

Finishing:

Bind off with the crochet bind off with one extra crochet stitch between each loom peg.
Weave in ends.
